Sir:-

I have the honour to report that the Reverend G.A. Artus S. J., of Wikwemikong, has approached me with regard to the question of making use of the Wikwemikonsing Day School building.

This school has been closed since the summer of 1914, and the building sitting there without any use being made of it whatever. It is situate close to the Roman Catholic Church in that district and it is the desire of the Reverend gentleman to make use of it as a shelter for the Missionary when visiting his parish in that district.

As this building has been vacated for a long period and it is difficult to watch it in order that it will not be destroyed and the Reverend Artus has promised to take good care of it if the Mission is allowed to made use of it, therefore, I would recommend that he be granted his request.
